

Checklist migration perspective

Use

This checklist follows the structure of the list for quality criteria. It enables you to test your migration sensitivity. It also identifies areas of your work where a migration approach can be introduced. Thus it is applicable in particular to the projects which are not (only) focused specifically on men and women with migration background.

If you use this checklist periodically, if you set quality objectives for the domains which are to be improved and implement corresponding measures, you will be able to evaluate and document your progress in the implementation of the migration approach.

1.	Basics of Health Promotion		
1.1	Health equity: Does the planned intervention promote health equity for the migrant population?		
1.2	Participation of principal actors in the settings: Are migrants involved in decision taking in the different phases of the project?		
2.	Assessment		
2.1	Demonstration of the need for the project: Do migrant participants / beneficiaries have specific needs? Have their needs been researched and documented?		
2.2	Needs of stakeholders and target groups: Are the needs of migrants adequately considered when planning the implementation of the measures?		
2.3	Learning from past projects: Have you taken into consideration the results and experiences of other projects which – whether specifically or not- aim at migrants and could inspire your approach?		
3.	Project planning		
3.1	Justification for proposed procedures: When planning the project's methodology, has it been considered if and when migrant-specific methods are needed? (Do interventions adequately take into consideration the linguistic difficulties, the migratory context, the view on health, etc?)		
3.2	Availability of necessary resources: Have you recorded the different types of resources of migrants, which could be of service to your project?		
4.	Project organization		
4.1	Adequate project structure: Are migrants adequately represented in the project organization (project team, advisory/steering groups)?		
4.2	Qualifications and requirements: If necessary, have measures been taken to ensure that the migrant's perspective regarding the topic is known to the project team?		
4.3	Goal-oriented networking: Have you considered the different options for collaboration synergies with the migrant networks?		

5.	Projekt management			
5.1	Formative evaluation: Is the evaluation migrant-specific regarding access to the implemented measures, success or drop-out rates and sustainability of the measures?			
5.2	Motivation and satisfaction of personnel: If need be, are the relations between migrant and other members of the project team and the effect this could have on the project subject of periodic discussion?			
6.	Effects			
6.1	Summary evaluation of goal attainment: Does the evaluation of the effects of the project take into account eventual differences between the migrant and indigenous population? Did you succeed in the aim of the project, that is really reducing health inequalities?			
6.2	Project documentation: Are migrant-specific differences documented in the project's report?			
6.3	Transfer and diffusion of results: Do you explicitly announce your migration sensitivity, your innovations, your concepts and/or your projects implementing these aspects to the public?
